

UNIFORM MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE LEGISLATION

Dissolution of Marriage

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Section 1. Marriage is dissolved only by (1) the death of one of the parties or (2) the judgment of ~~the~~ *a Court of competent jurisdiction* court decreeing a dissolution of the marriage.

Section 2. A judgment decreeing the dissolution of a marriage shall be granted only upon proof that the marriage has irretrievably broken down, and upon no other ground.

Section 3. The effect of a judgment decreeing the dissolution of a marriage is to restore the parties to the status of unmarried persons.

Section 4. A proceeding for the dissolution of a marriage shall be commenced by ~~the~~ filing ~~of~~ a petition, called a petition ~~of inquiry, with~~ *in* the clerk of the court, requesting the court to inquire into ^{*properly of the*} the continuance of the marriage.
